<p>Our school vision states that: We aspire for all at Parsonage Farm to feel valued and cared for, to have a continued excitement for learning, ensuring success as they journey onwards.</p> <p>Our art curriculum helps children to achieve our vision by inspiring and enabling our children to be creative and imaginative artists. We aim to develop the children's confidence in art by providing opportunities to experiment with colour, texture, form and pattern. We allow the children to develop their curiosity and express their emotions by being creative and imaginative through art. We teach a skills-based art curriculum, which is supported through studying a diverse range of artists. Here the children learn to appreciate a variety of styles of art and use them for inspiration for their own pieces of artwork. Children are provided with opportunities to think critically about their own work and those of other artists.</p> <p>Drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and collage are the main areas of work, (sometimes involving ICT) and children are taught progressively about line, texture, colour, pattern and form.</p> <p>Art is taught weekly by class teachers every other half term in KS1, focusing on an artist to develop a variety of skills, leading up to a final piece of artwork.</p> <p>In EYFS, the children explore art through play, creating pictures and sculptures using a variety of tools, techniques and materials. In our indoor and outdoor provision children have free daily access to a variety of resources for their creative work.</p> <p>As a school we have an agreed set of teaching and learning principles that all staff use to ensure they are delivering the highest quality lessons to our children. These can be found here: https://www.parsonagefarmschool.co.uk/page/?title=Curriculum&pid=29</p> <p>KS1 art lessons are recorded in sketchbooks which are available for staff, children and parents to access throughout the year.</p> <p>Enrichment</p> <p>Every year there is an art focus day to enrich the curriculum, during which collaborative pieces are created within the school and provide additional opportunities for the children to explore creatively. We also participate in 'Go Draw', a daily drawing event over 2 weeks.</p> <p>Wider Community</p> <p>Over the school year the children participate in events across the community such as the drawing competitions for Fleet Carnival and Mackenzie Smith.</p> <p>Children requiring additional support</p> <p>If children require additional support to access art lessons this will be tailored to their individual needs, based on any individual targets they may be working on. Examples of this support may be pre-teaching key vocabulary prior to the lesson, providing large scale resources for the children to work with, such as larger paintbrushes, chunky pencils, larger pieces of paper or allowing the children to use their fingers for painting to meet sensory needs.</p>	<p>Assessment of Art</p> <p>Within our Early Years classes, teachers are continuously assessing children's art through quality interactions in play, group sessions and whole class sessions. These assessments are on-going to help us ensure children are working towards our end of EYFS goals.</p> <p>In Key Stage 1, teachers informally assess children's progress through a range of strategies including discussions and observations which help them to make a half termly formal assessment as to whether each child has met the objectives of the unit.</p> <p>By the end of their time at Parsonage Farm, our art curriculum will have enabled children to be confident in discussing their likes and dislikes of art, exploring their creative artwork, understanding what steps they can take to develop their work or recognising when to stop if they are satisfied with their creative composition.</p>
