- His art is known as land art and is created in fields, forests, lakes and cities.
- His artwork does not last forever and can disappear quickly.
- He lives in Scotland and still creates sculptures.
- Natural objects are things that are found in the world around us and are not man made.
- Adding white to a colour is known as a tint and makes the colour lighter.
