- ❖ Andy Goldsworthy is a British sculptor and photographer.
- ❖ Andy Goldsworthy's sculptures are made using natural resources, such as stone, sand, water, ice, snow, leaves, flowers and berries.
- ❖ His art is known as land art and is created in fields, forests, lakes and cities.
- ❖ His artwork does not last forever and can disappear quickly.
- ❖ He lives in Scotland and still creates sculptures.
- ❖ Natural objects are things that are found in the world around us and are not man made.
- ❖ Adding white to a colour is known as a tint and makes the colour lighter.

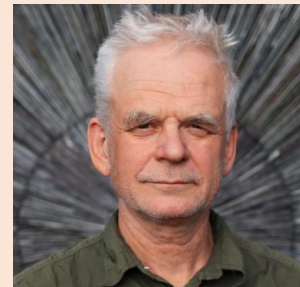


Safeguarding

Line _____
Is a mark with a beginning and an end.
It can be horizontal, vertical, skew, parallel etc.

Shape
Is an element of art that is two-dimensional, flat, or limited to height and width. Positive shapes represent solid objects and negative shapes show the surrounding space.

Tint
Is created by adding white to a colour.

Texture
The surface quality of an object or artwork.
