Knowledge

- ❖ Orla Kiely OBE is an Irish designer, she was born in 1963.
- ❖ Orla Kiely uses nature to inspire her designs.
- ❖ Orla Kiely's designs are recognisable by their bright colours and pattern, often of a stem with leaves.
- ❖ Orla Kiely has designed textiles, wallpapers, bags, clothes and cookware.
- ❖ In 2011 Orla Kiely was awarded an OBE for the work she has done in fashion and design.
- ❖ Adding black to a colour makes it darker, this creates a shade of a colour.
- ❖ Printing is the process of mark making by pressing a painted object onto another surface.
- ❖ Repeated patterns are designs that repeat again and again following a basic rule.

Line
Is a mark with a beginning and an end. It can be horizontal, vertical, skew, parallel etc.

Tone
Refers to the lightness or darkness of colours (tonal value).

Pattern
Is a design in which lines, shapes, forms or colours are repeated. The part that is repeated is called a motif. Patterns can be regular or irregular.

Shape
Is an element of art that is two-dimensional, flat, or limited to height and width. Positive shapes represent solid objects and negative shapes show the surrounding space.
