The Five Senses...	
 <p><b>Sight</b></p>	Your eyes let you see all the things around you.
 <p><b>Hearing</b></p>	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you. Your brain is able to tell what the different sounds are.
 <p><b>Touch</b></p>	Your skin gives you the sense of touch. You can tell if something is warm, cold, smooth or rough without even looking at it.
 <p><b>Taste</b></p>	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if something tastes bitter or sweet. You might have some taste you like and you dislike.
 <p><b>Smell</b></p>	You can smell using your nose. Your nose can tell if something smells nice or
