- ❖ There is variation in all living things.
- ❖ Animals and plants live in a variety of different places called habitats.
- ❖ Animals and plants have adapted to survive in different habitats.
- ❖ A habitat is a place where living things, such as animals and plants, can find all of the things they need to survive. This includes food, water, air, space to move and grow and some shelter.

Habitats

Examples of habitats:

-deserts -rainforests -woodlands -oceans
-seashore -forest -grassland -meadow



Microhabitats

Examples of microhabitats:

-individual trees -a pond -under a rock or log
